There is something special about the SEA CLOUD II, which will be clear as soon as you step on board this three-masted ship. For she has mastered the art of bringing everything and everyone together – combining the tradition of sailing with modern life, and cosy nostalgia with a great deal of freedom. The windjammer allows itself the luxury of being small but perfectly formed – there are only 29 outside cabins, 16 junior suites and two owner suites spread over three decks. Therefore, discerning cruisers can discover their passion for real sailing ships, whilst sailing enthusiasts will become devotees of great voyages.

The hours and minutes become meaningless, as a day on board the ship follows its own timetable. Every part of the ship, both inside and outside, is enticing. Whatever the time of day, you will be impressed by the tranquil atmosphere of the library, bar, restaurant and lounge with their stunning sea views. And when the crew gathers on deck to set the sails, the journey itself becomes the most wonderful pastime in the world.

The fine little SEA CLOUD CRUISES fleet is linked with the stars in more ways than one. Many highlights are waiting for you on board as well as on land. Top chefs Patrik Kimpel and Michael Philipp from the German section of an organisation of the best young chefs called the "Jeunes Restaurateurs", as well as famous Austrian chef Joachim Gradwohl from Meinl in Vienna, are ready to spoil you on two culinary cruises. We shall also be welcoming famous German author Professor Hellmuth Karasek on board, who will be adding his own blend of humour to the cruise from Hamburg to Warnemünde. Germany is not only a frequent departure and arrival point for our voyages. It is also a favourite stopover – for unique experiences such as Kiel Week in June and SAIL 2010 in Bremerhaven in August.

Patrik Kimpel

Patrik Kimpel is head chef and manager of the Kronenschlößchen hotel/restaurant in Hattenheim on the banks of the Rhine. He has trained under renowned German chefs Lothar Eiermann and Harald Wohlfahrt, and was awarded his first Michelin star in 1994. He has also been nominated "Chef of the year", and is now the new president of the illustrious 'Jeunes Restaurateurs Germany'. Patrik Kimpel's cuisine is light and fresh. Each of his dishes is sophisticated and presented with great attention to detail; a classic approach with a modern twist. His cookery courses are very popular, and many of his students come back again and again to further improve their culinary skills under his tutelage. The Kronenschlößchen hosts the world-famous RHEINGAU GOURMET & WINE FESTIVAL. Patrik Kimpel selects the menus for this event, cooking alongside some of the best chefs in the world.

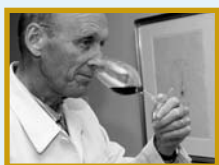
He will be on board for the **SEA CLOUD II** cruise from Lisbon to Pauillac, putting together two culinary events with interesting and practical "ingredients".

Michael Philipp trained under Fritz Schilling at the Schweizer Stuben restaurant in Wertheim. His own restaurant, Philipp, situated in the historic wine-producing village of Sommerhausen near Würzburg, serves an interesting combination of medieval and modern cuisine. Michael makes use of top-quality seasonal ingredients to produce his light creations inspired by French cuisine. For his dégustation menu, he uses only the very best fresh products from his own region and from around the world. He was awarded his first Michelin star in 2003, and in the same year he was accepted into the exclusive circle of 'Jeunes Restaurateurs Germany'.

Michael Philipp will be taking over from his predecessor between Pauillac and Hamburg. He will be presenting a menu created especially for **SEA CLOUD II** guests, and will be giving away a few of his gourmet tips.



René Lambert

René Lambert was born in Arcachon in Western France. Following four years of studying in Bordeaux, he worked as a teacher in North Africa and England, and later worked for an international shipping company in Hamburg. Between 1972 and 2003, he worked as an export manager for the wine dealer Dourthe Frères in Bordeaux. René concurrently wrote a book about wine, which was published worldwide. For the past eight years, he has accompanied several cruises on the MS EUROPA and SEA CLOUD II as a lecturer, passing on his extensive knowledge through his talks.

Leixões (Porto)/Portugal **Tue. 18 May**
Arrival: 14.00 hours. The morning is devoted to total relaxation as the ship sails along. If you would prefer to stay in La Coruña, you can try the local Galician specialities in the town's tapas bars as part of our tour*.** **Departure: 17.00 hours**

At Sea **Fri. 21 May**
You may spend today as you please. If you appreciate expert advice on wine, you will be particularly happy. Our wine expert, René Lambert, gives an insight into the wonderful world of Spanish wines. The day is rounded off beautifully with a dinner accompanied by said wines.

San Sebastian/Spain **Sat. 22 May**

Hamburg/Germany Sun. 30 May
Individual arrival in Hamburg. Embarkation on the SEA CLOUD II. Departure: 18.00 hours
In the beautiful late-afternoon light of May, the SEA CLOUD II glides down the River Elbe, past picturesque parts of the city and a beautiful landscape of dykes.

List/Sylt/Germany Mon. 31 May
Drop anchor: 14.30 hours. The afternoon and evening are free for you to discover the island as you wish. [Take a cycle tour* through the villages with their villas and captains' houses, with glimpses of sandy beaches to entice you.](#) You could visit Sylt's Frisian villages in the evening, or take a trip to Kampen, which for decades has maintained its reputation as an exclusive, chic and charming place.

Individual arrival in St Petersburg. Embarkation on the SEA CLOUD II.

The Yusupov Palace opens exclusively for our guests in the evening, and welcomes you to a caviar reception and concert*.

St Petersburg/Russia **Fri. 18 June**
On a city tour with a visit to the State Hermitage Museum*, you will sense the power of this place that has been forever set in stone. The city centre, a UNESCO World Heritage site, is both impressive and enchanting. The State Hermitage Museum is one of the most important museums in the world, and contains the world's largest collection of jewels.
Departure: 17.00 hours

Helsinki/Finland **Sat. 19 June**
Arrival: 13.30 hours. Helsinki has its own special Nordic appeal. A city tour with a visit to the cathedral* takes in the most important buildings of the Finnish capital.
Departure: 24.00 hours

Tallinn/Estonia **Sun. 20 June**
Arrival: 08.00 hours. Tallinn reflects the glory of the Hanseatic era, and was in the 15th century the most important trading centre on the Baltic. It is protected by UNESCO as a World Heritage site. Our walking tour* of the old part of the city, which is still hidden behind high walls, gives us a glimpse of upper-class life in the Middle Ages.

Stockholm/Sweden **Mon. 21 June**
Arrival: 17.00 hours. The rocky skerry islands transform the waters off the coast of Sweden into a unique natural landscape. As we approach the Swedish capital, the ship's rail of the SEA CLOUD II becomes a front-row seat. Make the most of the long summer evening as you visit the beautiful Swedish capital at your leisure.

Stockholm/Sweden **Tue. 22 June**
A city tour including a visit to the Vasa Museum* introduces you to the riches of Stockholm – a friendly, cosmopolitan and modern metropolis. In the afternoon, take the time to discover the city at your own pace as you wander through the beautiful streets.

Arrival: 13.30 hours. On a city tour* of Gdansk, the third Hanseatic city of our voyage, we will also visit the medieval St Mary's Church. The church took some 150 years to build, and it marks the starting point of Mariacka Street, the most beautiful street in the old town.

Kiel/Germany **Sat. 26 June**
The SEA CLOUD II reaches the Kiel Fjord in the morning, where up to 100 windjammers and sailing ships gather to take part in the traditional windjammer parade. The famed Kiel Week is a great experience for sailing enthusiasts and travelers alike.

Not only does the Kiel Week Regatta claim to be the largest sailing event in the world, but it is also the largest public festival in Northern Europe. Top class sailors from around the globe compete here in various classes of small craft, and there is the thrilling prospect of a sail-past by tall ships. On land, a music festival keeps the party in full swing. More than 5,000 sailors are expected each year, in international and Olympic dinghies, and about 250 off-shore yachts compete in the off-shore area of Alpha. The 'Holstenbummel' party fills the city centre with festive crowds as top bands perform on numerous stages around the Town Hall. Enjoy the best view in the first row aboard the Windjammer SEA CLOUD II.

Helsinki/Finland Sa., 03. Juli
Arrival: 18.00 Uhr. Vibrant, compact and adorable – the Finnish capital of Helsinki has a very special charm. Architecturally, it combines neoclassicism with art nouveau and modernism in the spirit of Alvar Aalto to create an airy overall impression that seems to transport the vastness of the country into the city.

Helsinki/Finland Sun. 04. July
Today's city tour leads us to Porvoo* the second oldest town of Finland with charming houses and narrow alleys. Departure: 23.00 hours

Tallinn/Estland Mon. 05. July
Arrival: 06.00 hours. The Estonian capital of Tallinn was one of the most important Hanseatic cities in the Baltic under the name of Reval. Its old town, which will be visited during a walking tour*, is a UNESCO World Heritage site. Departure: 12.00 hours

St Petersburg/Russland Di, 06. Juli
Arrival: 08.00 Uhr. After disembarkation city tour including St. Isaac's-Cathedral and 'The Church of Our Savior on the Spilled Blood'. Transfer to Hotel Astoria. Time to explore the city by your own. Overnight.

St Petersburg/Russia Wed. 21 July

The name of this city is enough in itself to inspire your imagination and conjure up the era of the tsars and bloody revolutions. Yet it is only once you have completed a city tour with a visit to the State Hermitage Museum* that you realise the extent of St Petersburg's power and magnificence. The State Hermitage Museum is a collection of buildings including the former tsarist residence, the Winter Palace. These days, the palace's 350 or so rooms-house one of the most important art collections in the world. If you wish, stand at the ship's rail as we journey down the River Neva, and enjoy the unique views of this city in the bright light of the white nights.

At Sea Thur. 22 July

Life on board will inspire dreams and a relaxed and leisurely life on the decks.

Tallinn/Estonia Fri. 23 July

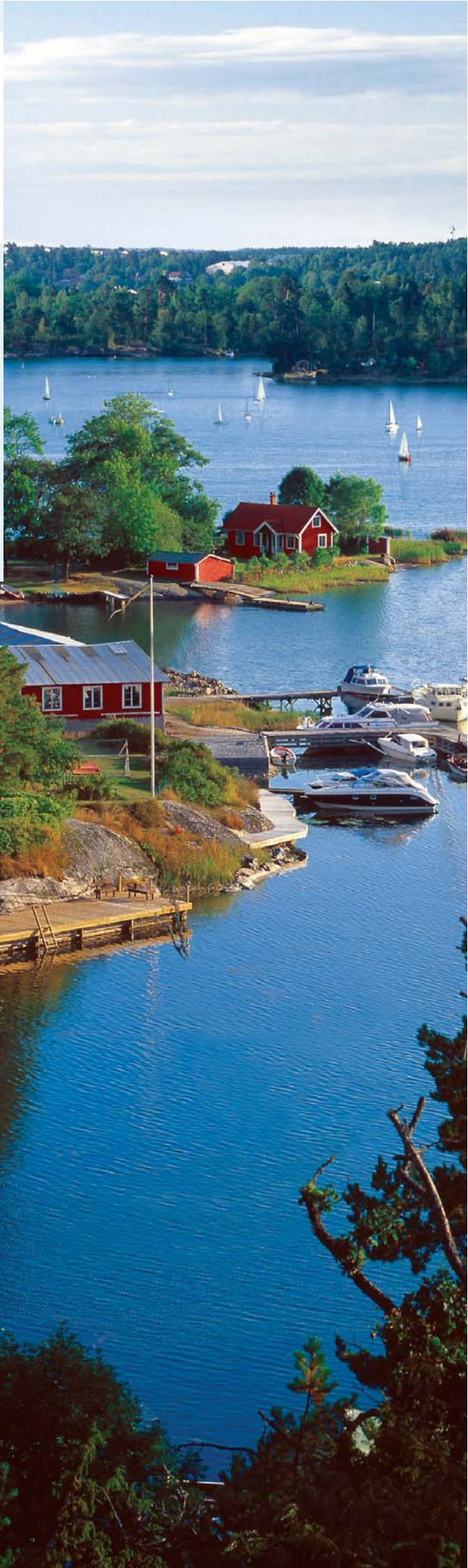

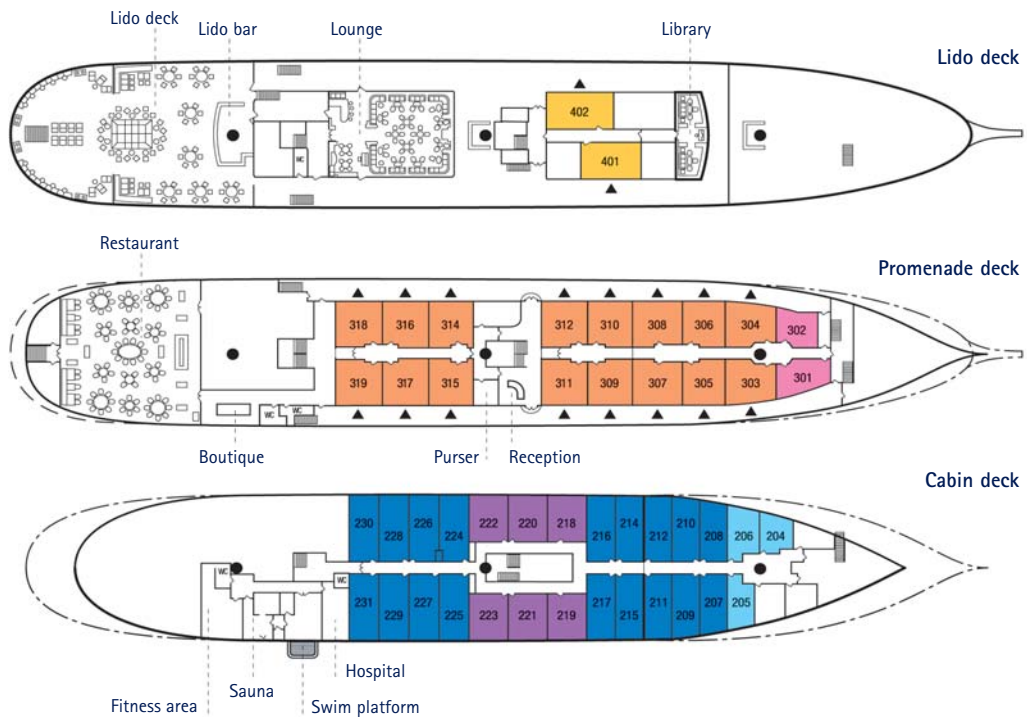
